2.1 Project Summary

This project aims to examine and review the latest development in adopting landscape planning towards climate adaptation in Asian and international contexts, and promote international exchanges among experts and professionals.

A 1.5-day conference was held on 22 and 23 November 2019. Day 1 was a conference related to the project topic and Day 2 was the Asian Townscape Awards (ATA) events. An exhibition was also held in the same venue, which included the display panels of the ATA and awarded projects, and also the introduction of the project *Resilient City – Landscape Planning towards Climate Adaptation*. On Day 1, landscape architects and related professionals in Hong Kong explored potential framework and principles in adopting landscape approach for disaster risk reduction, towards a resilient city that was suitable for application in Hong Kong and nearby regions. On Day 2, ATA events which were highly related to landscape architects, urban designers, and professionals of the built-environment, had provided rare opportunity for local professionals to enhance capacity and develop their international network.

The conference and ATA events facilitated exchanges and co-operation between landscape architects with their international and local counterparts.

The promotion of the conference and ATA events, and the dissemination of the booklet served as publicity for better exposure for the landscape architectural profession

Through the cross-boundary and cross-disciplinary exchange and co-operation, the knowledge-base of landscape architects and related professions in Hong Kong on the currently hot topic of climate resilience is enhanced, and therefore enhance also the competitiveness of Hong Kong's professional services.

3.5 Overall achievements of the project

The conference and ATA award ceremony have attracted 115 guests and participants including 30 overseas' guests despite the social unrest of the Hong Kong during the time. The ATA on its 10th anniversary received a record high of 69 submissions from over 15 countries/ regions, 14 were awarded and official delegates from several of those countries attended the event to receive the awards. The international and local experts have gained better understanding on the scope and potential contribution of the landscape architectural profession of Hong Kong. Mr. Michael WONG, JP, Secretary for Development; Mr. K.S. WONG, GBS, JP, Secretary for Environment; Dr. LEUNG Siu Fai, JP, Director of Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department; Mr. Kelvin LO Kwok-wah, Director of Drainage Services Department; and Mr. Takano FUMIAKI, President of the International Federation of Landscape Architect's Asia Pacific Region, recognized the achievement of this project and shared their congratulatory message as included in the published booklet.
