3.2 Feedback from participants / users / professional services sectors

Evaluation summary — ICFF-FFN

- Respondents: 169 participants
- Overall finding: Overwhelmingly positive feedback with no negative (Disagree/Strongly Disagree) ratings on any core evaluation items.

Key results (by question)

1. Was well organized — 96.5% positive
2. Had a well-structured program — >95% positive
3. Was interesting and informative — >95% positive
4. Provided information I can apply in current practice — 96.5% positive
5. Was a good learning experience — >95% positive
6. The duration of the event was sufficient — (included in overall positive results)
7. Likelihood to recommend to a colleague/friend — >95% affirmative

Notes

- Applicability to current practice (Q3) showed the most moderate response: 89.4% positive, with 8.3% selecting Neutral. This was the only non-positive response among the rating questions.
- Written feedback: 20 participants left comments. Most were highly complimentary, highlighting enlightening lectures, practical content, useful case discussions, and evidence-based protocols relevant to Hong Kong's hip fracture services.
- Requests and minor issues noted: participants asked for shared presentation slides, attendance certificates, and event recordings for those who missed sessions; a small number reported minor technical difficulties during the event.
- Additional interest: attendees expressed interest in Hong Kong's Fracture Liaison Service (FLS) initiatives and volunteer opportunities, and appreciated updates on technology and rare case presentations.

Suggested actions

- Consider providing slides and recorded sessions post-event.
- Issue attendance certificates if feasible.
- Review technical setup to prevent minor issues in future events.
- Follow up with interested participants regarding FLS and volunteering opportunities.
