2.1 Project Summary

An international conference "Transdisciplinary Model of Urban Aged-Care" was held on 31 October 2020. The conference drew together a congregation of international experts from different disciplinary backgrounds such as physiotherapists, occupational therapists, nurses, clinical psychologists, planners, architects and landscape architects with disciplinary backgrounds in the field of aged care to explore different feasible models of aged care in an urban environment like Hong Kong.

It is expected that an international interdisciplinary and inter-professional network in Hong Kong will be established for better synchronisation of hospital-based and community-based aged care services.

Tung Wah College hosted the international online conference on the topic of "Transdisciplinary Model of Urban Aged Care" on 31 October 2020, attracted over 400 of registrations from academicians and healthcare professionals from aged care, nursing, physiotherapy and occupational therapy. The Conference drew together a congregation of international experts from different disciplinary backgrounds to explore feasible models of Aged Care in an urban environment, and enhance the knowledge and skills of Aged Care professions through intensive interactions. 3.2 Feedback from participants / users / professional services sectors

A post-event feedback survey was conducted during the period from 2 to 9 November 2020, mass mail was sent to the participants on 2 November 2020. 96 participants provided their feedback.

In general, respondents provided positive feedbacks on the conference. Over 90% respondents agreed that the contents of the conference were up-to-date and highly relevant to their roles and responsibilities. In terms of the content coverage, more than 80% of the respondents agreed that the contents were sufficiently in depth and breadth. More than 90% of the respondents were satisfied with the audio and visual experience as well as the online conference platform. Over 90% of the respondents were satisfied with the performance of the speakers and the facilitators. All the respondents reported of enjoying this online conference. Respondents thought that the topic of this conference was great and all-round. Most of the respondents commented that it was very convenient for them to join the conference since it was delivered online.

As stated in the project proposal, two of the main objectives are:

- 1) To draw together a congregation of international experts from different disciplinary backgrounds in the field of aged care to explore different options of feasible models of aged care in an urban environment like Hong Kong;
- 2) To establish an international inter-disciplinary and inter-professional network based in Hong Kong for better synchronisation of hospital-based and community-based aged care services.

The project team is glad that both objectives have been met successfully through the conference.

The conference was successfully conducted with international experts from different disciplinary backgrounds in the aged care field, who were invited as keynote speakers. These included: experts from physiotherapy (Professor Sue Gordon), occupational therapy (Professor Lindy Clemson), nursing (Professor Claudia Lai), social work (Professor Cecilia Chan) and other disciplines such as architecture and practitioners in the aged care field. They delivered their speeches and shared their experience from different perspectives in this conference. Participants of this conference came from different disciplines and countries.

Secondly, an international inter-disciplinary and inter-professional network concerning the aged care services in Hong Kong was established after this conference, a certain number of participants indicated their interest to join the network. They have provided their contact details so that further connection could be made once a platform for the network is designed and ready to roll out.

Lastly, the knowledge and skills in the aged care field were enhanced through the interaction in this conference. The conference covered different disciplines and topics related to aged care, such as end of life care, community nursing care, architectural design of aged care services, technologically aided aged care. Practitioners and professionals shared their experience and insights in the conference.

According to the post-conference survey, respondents enjoyed this conference with a very high level of satisfaction and endorsement. Some of them even suggested that this conference could be held again.

3.5 Overall achievements of the project

A total of 455 local and non-local professionals registered this conference of which 399 people were from Hong Kong, 40 from the Mainland and 16 from overseas such as Australia and Thailand. 439 participants finally joined this conference on 31 October 2020, including 308 Hong Kong healthcare and other related professionals and 131 other participants.

The conference successfully provided a platform for professionals in different disciplines to share their insights and ideas on this global topic – aged care service. Professionals and practitioners exchanged their views and had a discussion about the future collaborations in this topic within their disciplines and across different disciplines. Riding on the establishment of an international inter-disciplinary and inter-professional network, it is expected that a greater chance of collaborations will be created and eventually beneficial to the professionals and Hong Kong society.
