The events invited the speakers with different regions (includes local, the Mainland, UK, Malysia) and professional backgrounds to share the best and latest practices of construction dispute resolution mechanism. Attendees can exchange and obtain the latest knowledge from the speakers' speech and Q&A session. With the hybrid mode (Onsite + Zoom), the event also received the enrolment and attendance of overseas participants, which created the chance of professional knowledge exchange with the counterparts in external markets.

3.5 Overall achievements of the project

The conference and seminars invited 18 speakers from local, Mainland and overseas to deliver the speech, and attracted more than 750 engineers to attend the events. Speakers shared their knowledge, rich experience and latest practices, and discussed several classic and representative cases on the handling dispute in the construction industry, which are valuable and enlightening for the attendees on adopting dispute resolution mechanism on the construction projects.

All events was summarised into the e-final report and uploaded to HKIE-CDRC website, together with the speakers' notes for public sharing. All sharing sessions was recorded and published on HKIE-CDRC YouTube Channel for review. These materials will be the valuable assets for local, even surroundings areas engineers for understanding and adoption of dispute resolution.
