- Given the upsurge in cases amid the COVID-19 pandemic in Hong Kong, demands for CM services and training have been accelerated tremendously. The ICMCM project played a substantial role in providing a platform for idea exchange and research discussion, also enhanced the professional knowledge of CM practitioners in Hong Kong, thereby uplifting the service standards of the sector and contribute to the fight against the pandemic.
- Heavy-weighted partners in both academia and industry from around the world were engaged in ICMCM conference, so as to facilitate academic exchange and research collaborations.
- The conference provided an opportunity for local and worldwide CM practitioners to discuss the latest discoveries on TCM based new drug and recent clinical research findings, which will help enhance the capability of local practitioners. In the meantime, the conference also examined different approaches across regions in handling TCM based new drugs. Latest research findings and clinical studies on CM were shared at the ICMCM conference, for examples, new drugs registered in China for international development such as the cancer drug from Nanjing, new drugs with both USFDA and China NMPA approval for international clinical trials, and clinical research in identifying the effectiveness of CM in various viral infections including COVID-19. Such timely research findings were considered important for the development of the TCM sector and public health.

• The project deliverables were also available online, including but not limited to HKTDC's online platform, for sharing among CM practitioners, healthcare professionals, academics, clinical researchers, CM pharmacists and industry players in Hong Kong and overseas.

3.5 Overall achievements of the project

- A total of 695 eligible beneficiaries were engaged
- As a "Continuing Medical Education (CME) accredited event, a total of 554 CM practitioners in Hong Kong acquired CME points by joining the ICMCM, the Conference encouraged practitioners to keep themselves up-to-date on current developments in CM practice, so as to maintain a high standard and external competitiveness of Hong Kong's CM professionals.
